3	Climate zones: Identify the different lines of latitude. Locate and compare temperate and tropical climate zones and explore the differences between the Northern and Southern Hemispheres.	North America: Locate North America on a map, identify countries within North America and states within the USA. Explore the physical and human geography of an area of North America. Compare life in Athens with life in the UK.	Volcanoes and earthquakes: Identify major volcanoes and locations and identify the main features and causes of volcanoes and earthquakes.	Local area and region: Locate and describe key physical and human of the region and local area. Understand local, regional, national and international links to the local area.
