Classroom News

Reception

We have had a very busy start to the year, it has been lovely to see the children return to school with such enthusiasm. We have begun our new topic for this term *Are We There Yet?* We are exploring transport and vehicles and how and why people travel, moving on to our *Adventure is Out There!* topic as we explore different places and journeys to get there.





Year 1

Year 1 were making fruit salads this week as part of our DT topic. We designed, made, ate and then evaluated them. We are going to use our work to write instructions over the next two weeks for our writing topic. The children helped chop and peel the fruit and we were using interesting verbs to explain what we were doing. We also got to try new fruits and a lot of us tried honey for the first time.





Year 2
