PTO News:

We have recently spent some PTO funds on new nativity costumes and advent activities across all classes. We are still investigating a new sound system and working on our ICT network support rather than the actual system at the moment.

The PTO have arranged for the school to have a textile bin on site so you can bring all your unwanted textiles to be recycled and raise money for the school. Our Eco Committee are very happy this service is available for everyone to use.

They will take:

Clothes, paired shoes, bed linen, accessories (such as belts, hats, gloves, scarves, handbags) as well as soft toys.

They can't take:

Duvets or cushions, off cuts, used underwear or socks, carpet or curtains.

When the recycling bin is emptied we get money paid to the school, and the best bit is that your unwanted textiles are sent to good use. Good quality textiles and garments will be sent to countries in Eastern Europe, and those not fit to be re-worn are shared on the global market to be recycled into many everyday products like pillow stuffing and even paper money!

The textile bin will be emptied fortnightly but if the bin is full prior to our allotted collection please email: pto-enquiries@hatchride.Wokingham.sch.uk and we can arrange an additional collection. Start recycling today and raise valuable funds for your school.
