December has been extremely busy between rehearsing, crafting, playing while still learning and finishing all of our topics! We have loved the advent event this year. Year 4

Year 4 have experienced a mix of Christmas and the Egyptian period, as their first term in Year 4 comes to an end. The children have all become reporters and written brilliant newspaper reports about the curse of Tutankhamun's tomb and I have enjoyed finding out all the fun facts they have been learning through reading at home. The increase in the amount of reading at home has been brilliant this half term! Egyptian day involved mummifying fruit, hieroglyphic code breaking and the creation of Egyptian art. Egyptian art is becoming a strength for the children as they have also created ancient Egyptian scrolls using the weaving method to make paper. All the children looked amazing in all their brilliant costumes and I was amazed at their thoughtful questions regarding the Egyptian period and the Romans.

To begin the countdown to Christmas, the children have enjoyed opening their class advent calendar and participating in a range of advent activities. The rice crispy cakes, although a mess, were fun to model and the children created a range of Christmassy designs. Alongside cake making, the children have made beautiful Christmas cards for the local care homes and spent time outside modelling wreaths with natural materials. They have spent lots of time practicing their songs for the KS2 Christmas festival and performed beautifully to both the school and parents.

Although the Egyptians and Christmas has been a large element of the children's learning this month, they have also been creating wallpapers using their knowledge of the repeat function in computing. In PE, the children have become experts in passing backwards in tag rugby and they have created excellent routines using a range of elements in gymnastics. Science has involved a puddle investigation to understand the states of matter and to practice drawing continuous line graphs. In French the children have been practicing describing their families and I look forward to moving on to describing their favourite places in the spring term.


Pupil Leadership Team

Get help with the cost of living

The **Household Support Fund** www.wokingham.gov.uk/cost-of-living/household-support-fund can help you pay for food, energy, bills and other essentials. It's open to:

- Families where children receive means-tested free school meals can get £20 per week during the school holidays until Easter 2024
- Anyone struggling to pay household bills or buy food can apply for £240 or £120 depending on the size of their household

If you've already applied for the Household Support Fund you do not need to apply again.

This includes things like air fryers, slow cookers, heated airers and more. These will lower your energy usage and bills
