



Curriculum

English

During the first half of the Autumn Term, the children will be focusing on two books: Shackleton's journey and The baker by the sea. Throughout both units of work, the children will be writing an array of text types including: travel brochures, newspaper reports, setting descriptions, poems and diary entries.

Maths

During the first half of the Autumn Term, the children will be learning place value with Miss Costello and measuring area with Mrs Loval. The place value includes partitioning, ordering, comparing and rounding numbers up to 4digits as well as looking at roman numeral rules.

Science

Year 4 begins with the topic of Sound. The children focus on how sound travels, how the ear works, frequencies and pitch as well as how musical instruments create sound.

After the half term, they move onto the water cycle which links to their Geography topics.

Reading

Throughout Year 4, a variety of genres will be read during Guided Reading, reading for pleasure time and book club.

Reading at home (3x a week)

- It is imperative that children are reading at home and being read to at home.
- Reading record must be signed 3x a week by an adult.
- The children are welcome to read books outside of their school books however to progress in the reading levels they must have read a wide variety of the school books in their level.
- Some parents last year found it useful to alternate the reading of a story. E.g., the children read one page, adult reads the next. They also found listening to their child in the car to be an easier space to encourage reluctant readers.

- Spelling words to practice will be set on Thursday and the spelling test will be the following Tuesday.
